Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof, by Publication, a designated method for giving notice, as shown by the Proof of Publication attached to the minutes. Notice of this meeting was given to all members of the Board and a copy of their acknowledgement of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to all members of the board of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Chairman called the meeting to order, and announced that a complete copy of the Open Meetings Act is posted on the wall in the meeting room.

The Chairman declared the minutes from the previous meeting shall stand approved as presented.

Plaque Presentation

Chairman Mach presented plaques to Irvin Cidlik and William Kozisek in appreciation of their dedicated service as County Board members. Both Cidlik and Kozisek have served as board members since 1999.

Update on Historic Bridge

Jim Rerucha, Highway Superintendent reported to the board that he had contacted Nels Raynor, Bach Steel of Holt, Michigan to obtain more information on their inquiry regarding the historical bridge that is located in Alexis Township. The company is interested in disassembling the bridge, restoring it, and selling it as a restored bridge. The Bellwood Northwest project (River Road) has been advertised, and the land appraisal has been completed. The Abie East bridge project is waiting for approval by the Corp of Engineers.

Agreement with Bryan Medical Center for Emergency Protective Custody Patients

Julie Reiter, County Attorney discussed with the board the need for Butler County to contract with Bryan Medical Center for reduced rates for the care of emergency protective custody patients that are admitted to the center. The County Attorney will be negotiating with Bryan Medical Center for a rate and will draft a contract for the board's consideration.

Treasurer's Certification of Homestead Exemptions

The County Treasurer certified that the total tax revenue that will be lost to all taxing agencies with the county from taxes levied and assessed in 2014 because of 324 homestead exemptions is \$267,481.42. The board accepted the certification and will place on file.

Payroll Changes due to LB560

Discussion was held regarding the changes that are forthcoming to the method of paying county employees. For those employees that are paid forward, adjustments will need to be made. Moved by Slama, seconded by Krafka to approve a one-day per pay period adjustment. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Slama, Krafka, Kozisek, Janak, Birkel, and Mach.
