BOARD PROCEEDINGS

February 1, 2016

A meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Butler County, Nebraska was held on the 1st day of February, 2016 at the Butler County Courthouse in David City, Nebraska at 9:00 a.m.

Present were the following: David W. Mach, Tony Krafka, Kevin Slama, Max Birkel, Scott Steager, Gregory A. Janak, and David L. Potter.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof, by Publication, a designated method for giving notice, as shown by the Proof of Publication attached to the minutes. Notice of this meeting was given to all members of the Board and a copy of their acknowledgement of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to all members of the board of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Chairman called the meeting to order, and announced that a complete copy of the Open Meetings Act is posted on the wall in the meeting room.

The Chairman declared the minutes from the previous meeting (January 19, 2016) shall stand approved as presented.

Motorgrader Costs

Jim Rerucha, Highway Superintendent presented information on motorgrader costs per mile. Further cost analysis will be done and presented at a future meeting.

Ditch Cleaning Policy & Driveway/Culvert Policy

The Highway Superintendent informed the board that NIRMA has a ditch cleaning policy that the county could adopt. Action on this matter is tabled for review of the statutes by the County Attorney.

Discussion was held regarding the Driveway/Culvert Policy that was presented for the board's consideration at a previous meeting. A revision will be made to the drafted policy, and will be presented at a future meeting for the board's consideration.

Moved by Slama, seconded by Birkel to enter into Board of Equalization. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Slama, Potter, Birkel, Janak, Steager, Krafka, and Mach. The following voted nay: None. Motion carried.

BOARD OF EQUALIZATION (SEE SEPARATE PROCEEDINGS)

Bond Election

Marc Munford, Ameritas Investment Corporation appeared before the board to present a resolution calling for a Special Election to be held in conjunction with the Primary Election regarding the proposition of the county to issue its general obligation bonds in a principal amount not to exceed \$1,950,000.00 for the purpose of financing the costs of a multipurpose facility for the Butler County Agricultural Society.

Board Member Janak offered the following Resolution and moved its passage and adoption:

THE COUNTY OF BUTLER, NEBRASKA RESOLUTION NO. 2016 – 04

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF BUTLER, NEBRASKA CALLING FOR A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE COUNTY IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE STATEWIDE PRIMARY ELECTION ON MAY 10, 2016 REGARDING THE PROPOSITION OF THE COUNTY TO ISSUE ITS GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS IN A PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT OT EXCEED \$1,950,000 FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING THE COSTS OF ACQUIRING, CONSTRUCTING, FURNISHING





AND EQUIPPING A MULTI-PURPOSE FACILITY FOR THE BUTLER COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY AND TO LEVY A PROPERTY TAX TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF, PREMIUM, IF ANY, AND THE INTEREST ON SUCH BONDS, WHICH TAX MAY EXCEED THE STATUTORY AND CONSTITUTIONAL LEVY LIMITATIONS OF FIFTY CENTS PER ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS OF TAXABLE VALUE.

WHEREAS, the County of Butler, Nebraska (the "County") is a county and political subdivision duly organized under Section 22-112, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended, and Chapter 23, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Butler County Agricultural Society (the "Agricultural Society") is an agricultural society duly formed and organized under the County Agricultural Society Act, Section 2-250 through and including 2-273, as amended (the "Agricultural Society Act"), for the purpose of operating and maintaining the Butler County Fair; and

WHEREAS, the Agricultural Society has requested that the County construct, equip and furnish a multi-purpose facility to be located on the Butler County Fairgrounds to be used by the Agricultural Society during the Butler County Fair and by community organizations and individuals throughout the year (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the County is authorized by Sections 23-120 et seq., Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended (the "Bond Act"), to borrow money and to issue bonds of the County for the purposes of acquiring, purchasing, constructing, removating, remodeling, furnishing, equipping, adding to, improving or providing County buildings and site or sites therefor, such as the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Bond Act further authorizes the Board to levy a tax not to exceed 5.2 cents on each one hundred dollars upon the taxable value of all the taxable property of the County to pay the costs of the proposed Project, including any bonds issued for such purpose; and

WHEREAS, Section 2-259 of the Agricultural Society Act provides that the County may levy up to 3.5 cents on each one hundred dollars of taxable valuation, or any part thereof, for the purpose of acquiring an interest in real property to comprise a portion or all of the county fairgrounds, for the purpose of capital construction on and renovation, repair, improvement, and maintenance of the county fairgrounds, or for the purpose of purchasing equipment, subject to Section 77-3443, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Nebraska Constitution and Section 23-125 of the Bond Act, such tax levies may not exceed the rate of 50 cents per one hundred dollars of the taxable value of all the taxable property in the County without first submitting the proposition to a vote of the qualified electors of the County at a special election ordered by the Board for that purpose and obtaining the approval of a majority of the qualified electors thereon; and

WHEREAS, the Board hereby finds it necessary to submit to a vote of the qualified electors of the County at a special election to be held in conjunction with the statewide primary election on Tuesday, May 10, 2016 the proposition described herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF BUTLER, NEBRASKA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Board of Supervisors (the **"Board"**) hereby directs and calls for a special election to be held in the County in conjunction with the statewide primary election on Tuesday, May 10, 2016 (the **"Election"**), at which time there shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the County the following proposition:

"Shall the County of Butler, Nebraska (the "County") issue its bonds in a total principal amount not to exceed \$1,950,000 for the purpose of financing the costs of acquiring, constructing, furnishing and equipping a multi-purpose facility on the Butler County Fairgrounds, including related site improvements, parking and infrastructure, to be operated by the Butler





County Agricultural Society; said bonds to be issued from time to time, to be sold at such prices, to bear interest at such rate or rates, to become due at such time or times (not to exceed 16 years), and to have such other terms and provisions, all as may be fixed and determined by the Board of Supervisors of the County; and

"Shall the County cause to be levied and collected annually a special levy of taxes against all the taxable property in the County, in addition to all other taxes to be collected by the County, sufficient in rate and amount to pay the principal of, the premium, if any, and the interest on said bonds as the same become due; provided, however, that such special levy of taxes shall not exceed the County's Constitutional and statutory limitations upon the levying of taxes by greater than 1.0 cent for each \$100 of taxable valuation and shall not be levied for more than 16 years?

Electors voting in favor of said proposition shall blacken completely the oval opposite the words "FOR said bonds and tax" following said proposition, and electors voting against said proposition shall blacken completely the oval opposite the words "AGAINST said bonds and tax" following said proposition.

Section 2. The County Clerk is hereby directed to transmit a certified copy of this Resolution to the Election Commissioner of the County no later than March 1, 2016.

Section 3. The Election shall be conducted in accordance with Sections 23-120 et seq., Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended (the "Act"), and Sections 32-101 et seq., Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended (the "Election Act"). The Election Commissioner shall conduct the Election on the question herein presented in all respects the same as other County elections and in the manner provided by law.

Section 4. As required by Section 32-802 of the Election Act, the Election Commissioner, no later than 40 days prior to the date of the Election, shall provide for publication of notice of the Election and posting of such notice in the office of the Election Commissioner. The County Clerk, pursuant to 23-126 of the Act, shall publish, or shall cause to be published, notice of the Election in the *Banner-Press*, being a legal newspaper of general circulation in the County, one time each week for four consecutive weeks, the first such publication occurring at least 20 days prior to the Election. The form of such notice of the Election shall be substantially in the form submitted to this meeting, a copy of which form shall be made a part of the minutes.

Section 5. The County Clerk shall furnish the final form of the ballot on the question presented herein to the Election Commissioner no later than 25 days prior to the date of the Election (or such earlier date as may be requested by the Election Commissioner). The form of ballot shall be substantially in the form submitted to this meeting (with any changes as may be required by the Election Commissioner), a copy of which form shall be made a part of the minutes. As required by Section 32-803 of the Election Act, the Election Commissioner shall publish, or shall cause to be published, the form of the sample ballot in the *Banner-Press*, being a legal newspaper of general circulation in the County, one time not more than 15 days nor less than 2 days prior to the Election.

Section 6. This resolution shall be and constitutes an order entered of record as contemplated by Section 23-125 of the Act.

Section 7. The Chair of the Board or the County Clerk is each hereby authorized and directed, in conjunction with the Election Commissioner, to do all other things and take all other action appropriate or necessary in order to cause said proposition to be submitted to the qualified electors of the County as above provided.

Section 8. This Resolution shall be in full force and take effect immediately upon the day of its adoption.

"Shall the County cause to be levied and collected annually a special levy of taxes against all the taxable property in the County, in addition to all other taxes to be collected by the County, sufficient in rate and amount to pay the principal of, the premium, if any, and the interest on said bonds as the same become due; provided, however, that such special levy of taxes shall not exceed the County's Constitutional and statutory limitations upon the levying of taxes by greater than 1.0 cent for each \$100 of taxable valuation and shall not be levied for more than 16 years?

April 4, 2016

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof, by Publication, a designated method for giving notice, as shown by the Proof of Publication attached to the minutes. Notice of this meeting was given to all members of the Board and a copy of their acknowledgement of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to all members of the board of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

2016-2017 Rural Transit Budget

If the Courthouse is closed, or if an employee cannot report to work because of weather conditions, the time lost shall be deducted from employee's wages (non-salaried), from accrued compensatory time, or from their accrued vacation at the employee's option.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof, by Publication, a designated method for giving notice, as shown by the Proof of Publication attached to the minutes. Notice of this meeting was given to all members of the Board and a copy of their acknowledgement of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to all members of the board of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Chairman called the meeting to order, and announced that a complete copy of the Open Meetings Act is posted in the meeting room.

Road Maintenance Policy Priorities

As per information that was received from the prior director, the Quickbooks (2014 and prior years) reports were located. The 2015 information will need to be entered in the Quickbooks program by the Senior Services Director, and moving forward all information will be entered in the program on a monthly basis and copies made.

Discussion was held as to the necessity of having an Assistant Director of the Senior Services Program. A job description will be created and the position will be advertised.

Discussion was held pertaining to the billing process for reimbursement for home delivered Medicaid and Title XX waiver meals supplied by the Senior Center. Stat. §§ 13-2901 et seq., enacted unanimously by the Legislature in 2008, authorizes political subdivisions within the State of Nebraska, including counties such as Butler County, Nebraska (the "County"), to enter into design-build contracts for most types of public projects if such political subdivision adheres to the procedures set forth in the Act;

WHEREAS, a design-build contract, as defined in the Act, is a contract which is subject to qualification-based selection between a political subdivision and a design-builder to furnish (a) architectural, engineering, and related design services for a project pursuant to the act and (b) labor, materials, supplies, equipment, and construction services for a project pursuant to the act;

WHEREAS, the Act requires that the governing body of a political subdivision, prior to adopting policies for entering into a design-build contract, to adopt a resolution selecting the design-build contract delivery system provided under the Act, and such resolution must be adopted by an affirmative vote of at least two-thirds of the governing body; and



WHEREAS, the adoption of such a resolution and such policies would not obligate the County to utilize the design-build contract delivery system for any specific future construction project of the County, but only affords the County the option to use the design-build contract delivery system for a project rather than the traditional design-bid-build contract delivery system.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 13-2904, that the County of Butler, State of Nebraska hereby adopts, by an affirmative vote of at least two-thirds of the members of the governing body, this resolution selecting the design-build contract delivery system provided under the Act. This Resolution is adopted to facilitate the construction of building improvements on the Butler County Fairgrounds. The County further directs the Butler County Agricultural Society to draft and present for consideration to the governing body, as soon as may be practicable, proposed policies pursuant to which the County, at its option, may enter into a design-build contract for building improvements on the Butler County Fairgrounds.

ATTACHMENT-REVISED PAYMENT IN LIEU OF MEDICAL INSURANCE

Qualified employee who are eligible to receive individual health insurance coverage as an employee benefit may elect a cash payment of \$500 per month in lieu of their individual health and dental insurance coverage. To be eligible for this payment, the employee must be eligible for the individual health and dental coverage offered to a county employee and must provide proof of qualified alternate insurance coverage to the County Clerk at the time of opting out of the County's group insurance plan. Should the employee discontinue or no longer be eligible for the alternate insurance coverage said employee must immediately notify the County Clerk of the same. An employee may not opt in to the County's group plan until the next open enrollment period unless allowed by Group Plan regulations. In order to remain eligible for the payment in lieu of medical insurance benefit, proof of qualified alternate coverage must be provided to the Clerk of the County every year during open enrollment for the group plan. The number of employees eligible for this benefit is contingent upon the County's group insurance plan participation requirements. If the number of employees requesting to opt out of the County's group insurance plan exceeds the maximum number of employees allowed by the group provider, the County reserves the right to limit the number of employees eligible for this benefit on a first requested basis. Butler County reserves its right to discontinue or reduce this benefit at any time.

Payment in Lieu of Insurance/Possible Action

Discussion was held regarding the amount that is paid to an employee who opts to take the payment in lieu of medical insurance. The current policy states that the employee may elect a cash payment of \$500.00 per month in lieu of their individual health and dental insurance coverage. Currently, the county contributes \$751.00 per month for an employee who enrolls in the Blue Cross-Blue Shield health and dental insurance coverage. It was discussed that the \$500.00 per month should be increased. It was the consensus of the board to maintain the \$500.00 amount, but revisit the issue next year.

FINDINGS OF FACT IN SUPPORT OF DENIAL OF BUTLER COUNTY LANDFILL, INC.'S LOCAL SITING APPROVAL APPLICATION

The Butler County Board of Supervisors ("Supervisors") hereby adopt the following findings of fact in support of its unanimous decision to deny Butler County Landfill, Inc.'s ("Applicant") Local Siting Approval Application. A true and correct copy of the denial is attached hereto as Exhibit A and contains the procedural background which is incorporated herein by this reference.

After consideration of the testimony and exhibits offered at the public hearing and the exhibits received during the public comment period the Supervisors found that Applicant failed to satisfy its burden to prove that the landfill expansion met three of the criteria set forth by Neb. Rev. Stat. Sec. 13-1703. A majority of the Supervisors found that Applicant failed to meet its burden of proof with respect to the criteria found in subparts (1) and (5) of that statute. The Supervisors unanimously found that the Applicant failed to meet its burden of proof with respect to the criteria found at subpart (2) of that statute.

After consideration of the testimony and exhibits offered at the public hearing and the exhibits received during the public comment period the Supervisors found that Applicant satisfied its burden to prove that the landfill expansion met three of the criteria set forth on Neb. Rev. Stat. § 13-1703. The Supervisors unanimously found that Applicant met its burden of proof with respect to criteria found at subparts (3), (4) and (6) of that statute.

The reasons for the decisions reached by the Supervisors on each criteria are set forth below.


1. Criteria 1

Neb. Rev. Stat. § 13-1703(1) requires an applicant to demonstrate:

(1) The solid waste disposal area or solid waste processing facility is necessary to accommodate the solid waste management needs of the area which the solid waste disposal area or solid waste processing facility is intended to serve.

A majority of the Supervisors found that Applicant failed to demonstrate that the landfill expansion is necessary. This decision is based on the following:

A. The landfill has adequate capacity to meet the needs of Butler County residents. The volume of solid waste generated by Butler County residents is a small percentage (i.e. less than 2%) of the total volume of solid waste disposed of at the landfill. A majority (over 67%) of the waste being currently accepted by the Landfill comes from the cities of Omaha, Blair, and Council Bluffs, IA. (E4)





- B. Sarpy County owns and operates a landfill near Springfield, Nebraska. Sarpy County will close this landfill in the near future. Several years prior to Applicant filing this application, Applicant's business affiliate (Waste Connections of Nebraska, Inc.) and Sarpy County entered into an agreement in March 2011 for solid waste disposal. Under this agreement, Applicant's affiliate has constructed and is operating a solid waste transfer station at the Sarpy County landfill, that as of a certain date Applicant's affiliate will deliver all solid waste collected by it in Sarpy County to this transfer station, and that such solid waste will be disposed of at Applicant's landfill or other landfills owned and operated by Applicant's affiliate and approved by Sarpy County. Applicant's affiliate will pay Sarpy County a host fee of a minimum of \$577,500 per year. In addition, Applicant is providing Sarpy County with a volume discount on the fees for disposing solid waste at Applicant's landfill. (E45, App. C; Pub. Tran. 60:18-61:7) Butler County is not a party to this contract.
- C. Butler County does not have an interlocal agreement, or other agreement, with any third party outside of Butler County (i.e. including any business, municipality, county, and Sarpy County in particular) that requires it to provide solid waste management services or a landfill for disposal for any areas outside Butler County. (E1)
- D. Butler County has alternatives for its waste in the event that the landfill ceases operation:
 - i. There is evidence that there are alternatives for some or all of the waste generated by Applicant's self-defined Business Area, including landfills located closer to the Applicant's major waste sources such as Pheasant Hill Landfill in Douglas County and Iowa Waste Systems in Malvern, IA. (E45 Sec. 2.5, Fig. 2.4, E7) These major waste sources and their volume of waste disposal at the landfill, are as follows:
 - Omaha 246,200 tons (45.6% of total);
 - Blair 57,100 tons (10.6% of total);





Council Bluffs – 60,900 tons (11.3% of the total). (E4)

The Local Siting Approval Application does not appear to include Council Bluffs and/or Iowa as part of Applicant's self-defined Business Area. (E45 Sec. 2.2, Fig. 2.2) These major waste sources will include, in the near future, Sarpy County (anticipating tonnage of 200,000 tons). (E45, Fig. 2-2) The capacity at the Pheasant Hill Landfill in Douglas County is such that its estimated remaining life is 88 years. (E5, pg. S-3)

- ii. There is evidence that Douglas County can take the waste from Butler County and Applicant did not provide convincing evidence or testimony to contradict this alternative or show why it is not a viable alternative. (E2);
- iii. There is evidence that York County can accept waste from Butler County and Applicant did not provide convincing evidence or testimony to contradict this alternative or show why it is not a viable alternative. (E3);
- iv. The record demonstrates that there are potentially alternative landfills in Douglas County, York County, Mills County, IA, Grand Island, Beatrice, Northeast Nebraska Solid Waste Coalition Landfill, G&P Development, Loup Central, Lincoln Bluff Road Landfill, Kearney, and Hastings. (E45 Sec. 2.5, Fig. 2.2, E2, E3, E5, E7, E70) Applicant did not provide sufficient evidence to demonstrate that other landfills identified in the record were not adequate alternatives to accept some or all of the waste from either Butler County or the Business Area defined by Applicant in its application.

For these reasons, a majority of the Supervisors determined that the Applicant failed to demonstrate that the landfill expansion is necessary.

Criteria 2

Neb. Rev. Stat. Sec. 13-1703(2) requires an applicant to demonstrate:

(2) The solid waste disposal area or solid waste processing facility is designed, located, and proposed to be operated so that the public health, safety, and welfare will be protected. The applicant shall provide an evaluation of the potential for adverse health effects that could result from exposure to pollution, in any form, due to the proper, or improper construction, operation, or closure of the proposed solid waste disposal area or solid waste processing facility.

The Supervisors unanimously determined that Applicant failed to satisfy criteria two.

This decision is based on the following:





- A. The Applicant failed to adequately provide an evaluation of the potential for adverse health effects that could result from the exposure to pollution due to the improper construction, operation, or closure of the proposed solid waste disposal area.
 - i. Applicant provided evidence about the landfill's historical compliance with environmental regulatory requirements, safeguards and safe operation of the proposed expansion of the facility if properly constructed, operated and closed. (E45 pgs. 18 21, App. G, H, Pub. Tran. 22:8-23:12, 38:17-43:5);
 - ii. Applicant did not include any evaluation of potential adverse health impacts that could result from improper construction, operation or closure;
 - iii. Applicant provided testimony that the facility receives 100 tons of fly ash every day. (E45, pg. 7; Pub. Tran. 62:20-25) Applicant testified that it has conducted health and safety evaluations of fly ash. (Pub. Tran. 59:8-19). Applicant failed to provide this or any other evaluation regarding the potential adverse health impacts of fly ash on site or to the surrounding area;
 - iv. There was testimony of dust and trash blowing offsite from the current landfill operation and truck traffic to and from the site; (Pub. Tran. 110, 114-117, 122-124, 142-145, 163-167, Ex. 19, 46-49, 52-54)
 - v. Applicant provided evidence of its current groundwater monitoring activities, but failed to provide an evaluation regarding the potential adverse health impacts of possible contamination of ground water or surface water. (Exs. 12, 13, 43)

For these reasons, the Supervisors unanimously determined that the Applicant failed to satisfy criteria 2.

3. Criteria 3

Neb. Rev. Stat. Sec. 13-1703(3) requires an applicant to demonstrate:

(3) The solid waste disposal area or solid waste processing facility is located so as to minimize incompatibility with the character of the surrounding area and to minimize the effect on the value of the surrounding property. The city council, village board, or county board shall consider the advice of the appropriate planning commission regarding the application;





- A. The Landfill is located in a rural area of Butler County. (E45, Sec. 1.2, Fig. 1-1, Sec. 4.2)
- B. The Landfill has been operating as a landfill in that location since 1986. (E45, Sec. 1.2)
- C. There was no evidence offered regarding the effect of the expansion on the value of the surrounding property.
- D. The expansion would minimally impact the surrounding area because the surrounding area is already adjacent to an existing landfill facility.
- E. Butler County does not have a Planning Commission or similar body to provide advice regarding the application.

For these reasons, the Supervisors unanimously determined that the Applicant satisfied Criteria 3.

4. Criteria 4

Neb. Rev. Stat. Sec. 13-1703(4) requires an applicant to demonstrate:

- (4) The plan of operations for the solid waste disposal area or solid waste processing facility is designed to minimize the danger to the surrounding area from fire, spills, or other operational accidents;
- A. Applicant provided evidence about the landfill's historical compliance with environmental regulatory requirements, safeguards and safe operation of the proposed expansion of the facility if properly constructed, operated and closed. (E45 pgs. 18 21, App. G, H, Pub. Tran. 22:8-23:12, 38:17-43:5)
- B. Applicant provided information regarding its response measures in the event of operational accidents. (E45, App. H)





C. There was no evidence or testimony refuting Applicant's position that its plan of operations for the landfill expansion is designed to minimize the danger to the surrounding area from fire, spill, or other operations accidents.

For these reasons, the Supervisors unanimously determined that the Applicant satisfied Criteria 4.

5. Criteria 5

Neb. Rev. Stat. Sec. 13-1703(5) requires an applicant to demonstrate:

(5) The traffic patterns to or from the solid waste disposal area or solid waste processing facility are designed to minimize the impact on existing traffic flows.

A majority of the Supervisors found that Applicant failed to demonstrate that the expansion of the landfill was designed to minimize the impact on existing traffic flows. The decision is based on the following:

- A. There was testimony that the increase in volume of waste disposed of at the landfill, particularly from waste from Sarpy County, would add up to 25 additional semi-truck loads per day. (Pub. Tran. 51:10-13)
- B. There was no analysis of the impact this additional truck traffic would have on Q Road and traffic flows on Q Road. (Pub. Tran. 159-160)
- C. There was testimony that the conditions of R Road are dangerous, that citizens avoid taking "dump road" and instead find alternative routes, and that R Road conditions and/or landfill traffic have resulted in damage to vehicles. These conditions and wear on Road R are caused by the truck traffic to and from the landfill. (Pub. Tran. 111, 115, 118-122, 130-132, 142, Ex. 46-49, 59, 64)
- D. Applicant did not provide sufficient evidence regarding the actual traffic flows to satisfy its burden under Criteria 5. (E45, App. J)





For these reasons, a majority of the Supervisors determined that the Applicant failed to satisfy criteria 5.

6. Criteria 6


Neb. Rev. Stat. Sec. 13-1703(6) requires an applicant to demonstrate:

- (6) Information regarding the previous operating experience of a private agency applicant and its subsidiaries or parent corporation in the area of solid waste management or related activities are made available to the city council, village board, or county board. If a corporation, a parent company or subsidiary thereof, or any officer or board member of the corporation or the parent company or subsidiary applying for approval has been convicted of a felony within ten years of the date the application is filed, site approval shall not be granted.
- A. Applicant provided evidence about the landfill's historical compliance with environmental regulatory requirements, safeguards and safe operation of the proposed expansion of the facility if properly constructed, operated and closed. (E45 pgs. 18 21, 28, App. G, H, Pub. Tran. 22:8-23:12, 38:17-43:5)
- B. Applicant provided undisputed evidence that it had not been convicted of a felony within ten years of the date of the application. (E45, pg. 28)

For these reasons, the Supervisors unanimously determined that the Applicant satisfied Criteria 6.

DECISION REGARDING SITING APPROVAL

This is a proceeding under Section 13-1701 through 13-1714 of the Nebraska Revised Statutes resulting from the filing of a Local Siting Approval Application Butler County Landfill, Inc. ("Applicant") received on July 6, 2015. On October 28, 2015, a public hearing was held pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. Sec. 13-1706 at the David City Auditorium at 699 Kansas Street, David City, Nebraska at which evidence was presented. Written comments were allowed to be filed with the County Board concerning the site for a period thirty (30) days following the hearing and such written comments were included in the record of this matter.

Subsequent to the thirty (30) day comment period, the Butler County Board of Supervisors, pursuant to law, met on the 14th day of December, 2015, at 9:00 a.m. in the District Countroom of the Butler County Courthouse in David City, Nebraska for a special meeting for the purpose of considering all evidence presented and approval or disapproval of the application of the local siting approval application filed by Butler County Landfill, Inc.

The Special Meeting was duly convened at 9;00 a.m. by Chairman of the Butler County Board of Supervisors, Dave Mach. Present were Supervisor Mach, Supervisor Slama, Supervisor Birkel, Supervisor Krafka, Supervisor Janak, Supervisor Potter, Supervisor Steager, and County Attorney Julie Reiter. Present for Applicant were representatives Kelly Danielson, and its attorney Steve Mossman. Also present were various members of the public.





It was moved by Supervisor Greg Janak and seconded by Supervisor Tony Krafka that Julie L. Reiter, Butler County Attorney, be appointed as special meeting officer to preside over the meeting. The motion unanimously passed.

Discussion was then had regarding all six criteria set forth in section 13-1704.

FINDINGS

- The Applicant, Butler County Landfill, Inc., pursuant to section 13-1704, served and published notice.
- The Applicant, Butler County Landfill, Inc., submitted a Local Siting Approval Application for a proposed expansion of a solid waste disposal area. The Application was received by the County on July 6, 2015.
- 3. Notice of Public Hearing was properly given pursuant to section 13-1706.
- 4. A public hearing, pursuant to Section 13-1706, was held by the County Board of Supervisors of Butler County on October 28, 2015, beginning at the hour of 7:00 p.m. at the David City Auditorium, David City, Nebraska to consider the Local Siting Approval Application submitted by Butler County Landfill, Inc. Supervisors Mach, Slama, Birkel, Krafka, Janak, Potter, and Steager were present. Julie Reiter, County Attorney for Butler County, presided as Hearing Officer. Butler County Landfill, Inc. was represented by attorney Steve Mossman. Oral evidence was presented by the Applicant and by others. Exhibits 1 through 56 inclusive were introduced and received into evidence. The public hearing was transcribed by a court reporter and included as part of the record of the public hearing.
- 5. For a thirty (30) day period following the Public Hearing, written comments were accepted and included in the record of the hearing. These documents and/or comments are Exhibits 57 through 76 inclusive and are included in the record of the public hearing.
- 6. On December 14, 2015, a Special Meeting of the Supervisors of Butler County was held pursuant to lew and was convened. Supervisors Mach, Slama, Birkel, Krafka, Janak, Potter, Steager, and County Attorney Julie Refter were present. The same was transcribed, and a transcription of said meeting is attached hereto marked Exhibit "A", and by reference made a part hereof.
- The evidence and information presented by the Applicant and others on its behalf
 does not demonstrate compliance with all of the requirements set forth within
 Section 13-1703.





CONCLUSIONS

Based upon the finding that the Applicant has failed to meet all oriteria required to be met under Section 13-1703 it was moved by Supervisor Kevin Slama and seconded by Supervisor Greg Janak that the Local Siting Approval Application filed by Butler County Landfill, Inc. be denied. Upon roll call vote, the motion was unanimously passed.

There being no other stated purpose for the Special Meeting, it was moved by Supervisor Scott Steager and seconded by Supervisor Tony Krafka that the meeting be adjourned. Upon roll call vote, said motion was unanimously passed and the meeting duly adjourned.

Board of Equalization (See separate proceedings)

Discussion

Supervisor Janak reported to the board that the grant funding application for the Rural Transit garage project is complete and ready for submission to the Nebraska Department of Roads.

Floodplain Questions

Dennis Kirby appeared before the board with questions relating to the Floodplain Ordinance. Mr. Kirby owns a farm in Section 36, Township 14 North, Range 3 East that partially lies in the floodplain. A dirt fill/dike was constructed on the property, which required him to apply for a floodplain permit. He presented photos of the area, for the board to review. The photos will be included in the Floodplain Administrator's file. Mr. Kirby was questioning the next step in the permit application process, which is the requirement to obtain a no-rise study/certificate from a licensed engineer. Robin Sullivan, Floodplain Administrator explained that if he chose not to obtain the no-rise study/certificate; the dirt fill/dike would need to be removed, which would require a development permit.

Bids for Snow Removal

Bids were solicited for snow removal in the Sheriff's office parking lot and sally port of the Detention Center located on the northwest corner of the Courthouse. No bids were received. It was the consensus of the Board that the County Road Department take care of the snow removal.

Document Preservation

At the last meeting, the County Clerk discussed with the board the problem that has been discovered with the acetate rolls of microfilm that are deposited with the State Archives. The microfilm rolls contain records that are relied on as a backup in case of a natural disaster. Bob Fountaine, MIPS Inc. Microfilming Division appeared before the board to discuss the options that are available to have the acetate rolls of microfilm silver duplicated and brown toned or rescanning the original documents. It was also discussed to include the County Surveyor records in the project. An estimate for the addition of the County Surveyor records will be compiled and sent to the County Clerk.

Funding Request/Butler County Visitors Improvement Fund

Michael Rethwisch, Butler County Visitors Committee appeared before the board to relay the committee's recommendation on the request for funds from the Butler County Historical Society. The Butler County Historical Society has requested \$7,000.00 to purchase and install heating and air conditioning equipment in the Butler County Historical Museum (Burlington Northern Railroad Depot). Larry Peirce, President and Greg Fiala, Treasurer of the Historical Society gave a brief history of the Historical Society and an overview of the proposed project. Moved by Birkel, seconded by Krafka to authorize \$5,000.00 towards the estimated \$7,000.00 purchase price to install heating and air conditioning in the Butler County Historical Museum. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Birkel, Janak, Steager, Krafka, Slama, Potter, and Mach. The following voted nay: None. Motion carried.





There being no further business to come before the board, the Chairman adjourned the meeting at 11:30 a.m.
