BOARD OF SUPERVISORS BUTLER COUNTY, NEBRASKA RESOLUTION NO. 2018 - 04

WHEREAS, Nebraska Statutes instruct County Supervisors to establish salaries for elected county officials prior to the election year preceding the four-year term during which a person will hold the office.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Butler County Board of Supervisors that the following annual salaries be established.

1. The annual salary for the office of the County Board be established at \$27,000.00 for the calendar year 2019, plus an annual increase during the term of office (2020, 2021, 2022) based on the Consumer Price Index as established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U. S. Department of Labor; said increase to be not less than two percent (2%) and said increase not to exceed five percent (5%).

2. The annual salary for the office of the County Clerk be established at \$56,000.00 for the calendar 2019, plus an annual increase during the term of office (2020, 2021, 2022) based on the Consumer Price Index as established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U. S. Department of Labor; said increase to be not less than two percent (2%) and said increase not to exceed five percent (5%).

3. The annual salary for the office of the County Treasurer be established at \$56,000.00 for the calendar 2019, plus an annual increase during the term of office (2020, 2021, 2022) based on the Consumer Price Index as established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U. S. Department of Labor; said increase to be not less than two percent (2%) and said increase not to exceed five percent (5%).

4. The annual salary for the office of the County Assessor be established at \$56,000.00 for the calendar 2019, plus an annual increase during the term of office (2020, 2021, 2022) based on the Consumer Price Index as established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U. S. Department of Labor; said increase to be not less than two percent (2%) and said increase not to exceed five percent (5%).

5. The annual salary for the office of the Clerk of the District Court be established at \$56,000.00 for the calendar 2019, plus an annual increase during the term of office (2020, 2021, 2022) based on the Consumer Price Index as established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U. S. Department of Labor; said increase to be not less than two percent (2%) and said increase not to exceed five percent (5%).

6. The annual salary for the office of the County Sheriff be established at \$67,000.00 for the calendar 2019, plus an annual increase during the term of office (2020, 2021, 2022) based on the Consumer Price Index as established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U. S. Department of Labor; said increase to be not less than two percent (2%) and said increase not to exceed five percent (5%).

7. The annual salary for the office of the County Attorney be established at \$67,000.00 for the calendar 2019, plus an annual increase during the term of office (2020, 2021, 2022) based on the Consumer Price Index as established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U. S. Department of Labor; said increase to be not less than two percent (2%) and said increase not to exceed five percent (5%). The County Attorney position is designated as part-time.

8. The annual salary for the office of the County Surveyor be established at \$16,800.00 for the calendar 2019, plus an annual increase during the term of office (2020, 2021, 2022) based on the Consumer Price Index as established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U. S. Department of Labor; said increase to be not less than two percent (2%) and said increase not to exceed five percent (5%). The County Surveyor position is designated as part-time and would include those duties prescribed by the Nebraska Statutes. This position receives no health or dental insurance benefits.

9. The annual salaries for the Deputy Clerk, Deputy Assessor, Deputy Clerk of the District Court, Deputy Treasurer and Deputy County Attorney be established at 75% of the Official's salary for the calendar year 2019, plus an annual increase during the term of office (2020, 2021, 2022) based on the Consumer Price Index as established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor; said increase to be not less than two percent (2%) and said increase not to exceed five percent (5%).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the county reserves the right to enter into any agreement with an elected official or officials who is qualified to serve as the budget-making authority as may be approved by the Board. It is the intent of the Butler County Board that such agreement shall not constitute an increase in the herein adopted salary but shall be paid to said official or officials as allowed by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in addition to the above stated salary; the County Board of Supervisors, County Clerk, County Treasurer, County Assessor, Clerk of the District Court, County Sheriff, and County Attorney shall receive during his or her term of office at county expense the employee's portion of the County's health and dental plan, the same as offered to all county employees.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, if notice of the same be necessary, the county reserves the right to enter into any program for the benefit of employees of the county, any other programs as may be approved, with the right of elected officials and deputies granted to participate in such programs on the effective date of such programs as approved by the board. It is the intent of the Butler County Board of Supervisors that participation in such programs shall not constitute an increase in the herein adopted salary but shall be and is part of such salary as adopted and approved by this resolution.



WHEREAS, Butler County, Nebraska ("Butler County") provides a public safety answering point ("PSAP") which receives 911 service calls and either dispatches emergency services or relays calls to the appropriate public service agency, and

WHEREAS, the Nebraska Public Service Commission, pursuant to the Enhanced Wireless 911 Services Act, has set a surcharge to be collected by wireless carriers and paid by their wireless customers to help fund certain costs of E-911 Wireless, and

WHEREAS, Butler County receives a portion of the surcharge funds from the Nebraska Public Service Commission, and is allowed to save or set aside up to 75% of the funds received for future equipment/software purchases and upgrades, and

WHEREAS, for the fiscal year 2016-2017 all funds received were deposited into the 911 Wireless Service Fund,

WHEREAS, Butler County is allowed to set aside funds in the amount of \$2,410.96, the amount remaining from fiscal year 2016-2017 for future equipment/software purchases and upgrades.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Butler County Board of Supervisors that the Butler County Treasurer be hereby directed to transfer \$2,410.96 from the 911 Wireless Service Fund to the 911 Wireless Service Holding Fund.



Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof, by Publication, a designated method for giving notice, as shown by the Proof of Publication attached to the minutes. Notice of this meeting was given to all members of the Board and a copy of their acknowledgement of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to all members of the board of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Chairman called the meeting to order, and announced that a complete copy of the Open Meetings Act is posted in the meeting room.

The Chairman declared the minutes of the previous meeting shall stand approved as presented.

Utility Permit Request/Windstream

Windstream Nebraska, Inc. submitted a utility permit request. Following review by the Highway Superintendent, Windstream Nebraska, Inc. was notified that there will be a bridge removed at that location in the near future. Windstream Nebraska, Inc. will coordinate their work at the same time as the bridge work is completed.

Cost Share Pavement Overlay/H Road

Jim Rerucha, Highway Superintendent was contacted by a representative from Pavers, Inc., who is contracted to complete street repairs for the Village of Bellwood, asking if the county was needing any payment overlay work completed. Discussion was held on the possibility of entering into a cost share with the Village of Bellwood for pavement overlay on H Road. Ulysses Township/Quarterly Payment Shortfall

The County Attorney is instructed to draft a letter to the township, on behalf of the board, informing the township of the breach of contract.

Intersection of U Road and 25 Road Recommendations

Mainelli Wagner & Associates, Inc. has completed a study of this intersection, and have made recommendations to change the traffic flow. The recommendations were reviewed by the Road and Bridge Committee, and the committee is recommending that the intersection be squared up and remove the curves.

Moved by Janak, seconded by Slama to approve reconstruction of the U Road and 25 Road intersection. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Janak, Steager, Krafka, Slama, Potter, Birkel, and Mach. The following voted nay: None. Motion carried.

The Highway Superintendent will contact the Richardson Township board to inform them as to the work that will take place at this intersection.





The Highway Superintendent is instructed to present an Amendment to the Butler County Culvert Policy for the board's consideration at the March 19, 2018 meeting.

Placement of Poles on County Right-of-Way in Bone Creek Township

Jim Rerucha, Highway Superintendent informed the board that he had received a request from Butler Public Power District to install power poles in the county right-of-way along 41 Road between Q Road and R Road. The adjacent landowners are requesting that the poles be installed along the existing fence line. The Highway Superintendent will be meeting with Tim Baxter (NIRMA-Road Safety and Loss Prevention Specialist) at the site to review. It is the consensus of the board that the poles not be installed in the right-of-way.

Lease of County Property in Linwood Township

Butler County owns 12.53 acres in Section 35, Township 16 North, Range 4 East. In the past, the entire piece of property has been leased. The Highway Superintendent informed the Board that the Road Department would like to keep an additional 2 acres for a rip-rap storage area.

Supervisor Steager announced that he had information on the upcoming visit from Vice-President Mike Pence to Council Bluffs, IA and Omaha, NE.







Date and Time to Accept Bids



Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to all members of the board of this meeting. Discussion/Road Record Book

Discussion was held regarding a Road Record book. The record books that are currently in the County Surveyor's office will be turned over to the County Clerk's office and moving forward any road matters will be notated in the book.

Right-of-Way Changes/Offset Right-of-Way from Section Line

Discussion was held with the Highway Superintendent that there are projects where the road or bridge is not true to the section line. It was the consensus of the board that as long as the road improvement being made is within the 66' right-of-way, the project would be built as it fits within that right-of-way.

Refusal of Bids on Truck Chassis

The cost of rock that will be used on the landfill road will be shared 50/50 by Butler County and Butler County Landfill. The dust control will still remain the responsibility of the landfill.

Decision on Culverts Bids

Following review of the bids submitted, the Highway Superintendent is recommending to accept the bids submitted by Contech Engineered Solutions LLC and Midwest Service and Sales Co. based on product availability and proximity. 

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS BUTLER COUNTY, NEBRASKA RESOLUTION NO. 2018 - 24

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Nebraska Statute 77-3443, each County Board shall adopt a resolution by a majority vote of members present which determines a final allocation of levy authority to its political subdivisions, and

WHEREAS, political subdivisions as defined in said statute are "all political subdivisions <u>other</u> than school districts, community colleges, natural resources districts, educational service units, cities, villages, counties, rural and suburban fire protection districts that have levy authority pursuant to subsection (10) of section 77-3442, and sanitary and improvement districts, and

WHEREAS, statute states that they may levy taxes as provided by law, provided they do not collectively total more than fifteen cents per one hundred dollars of taxable valuation on any parcel or item of taxable property for all governments for which allocations are made by the County, and

WHEREAS, on or before August 1st, all political subdivisions subject to county levy authority must submit a preliminary request for levy allocation to the County Board, and

WHEREAS, failure of a political subdivision to do so shall preclude them from using procedures set forth in 77-3444, and

2018-2019 County Budget Discussion

The Budget Committee reported to the full board on the status of the 2018-2019 County Budget. Discussion was held pertaining to the valuation that has been certified by the County Assessor, and the proposed levy. It was the consensus of the board to budget for a transfer from the Inheritance Tax Fund in the amount of \$250,000.00 as a way to reduce the amount of property tax requested.

Discussion

Information was shared by Julie Reiter, County Attorney and Supervisor Janak on a meeting that they attended at the request of Mark Adams and Kelly Danielson, Waste Connections/Butler County Landfill. Information was relayed by Mr. Adams and Mr. Danielson, that a new local siting approval application may be filed in September. The new application will include the paving of R Road and the 1400' of Q Road past Octavia, which would start following county approval of the application. Mr. Adams and Mr. Danielson also questioned if the board would enter into negotiations for a host fee agreement that would not be contingent on the siting application, but could be rescinded if the application is not approved. The board instructed the County Attorney to reach out to the representatives, relaying that the board would be open to negotiating a host fee agreement but not at the proposed \$.85 per ton.

Butler County Landfill Public Records Request

The County Attorney discussed with the board the June 26, 2018 Public Records Request that was made by Mattson Ricketts Law Firm, which represents the Butler County Landfill, in which the county responded with 346 pages of documents requested. A request for additional information and documentation was received on August 8, 2018. The County Attorney explained that the additional information and documentation is being compiled to fulfill the subsequent request.

Claims

Moved by Slama, seconded by Krafka to approve for payment the claims as presented, except the salary claim of Jim Rerucha, which is to be modified to reflect the rate of \$26.53 per hour. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Slama, Krafka, Steager, Janak, Birkel, Potter, and Mach. The following voted nay: None. Motion carried.







BUTLER COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

October 1, 2018

A meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Butler County, Nebraska was held on the 1st day of October, 2018 at the Butler County Courthouse in David City, Nebraska at 9:00 a.m.

Present were the following: David W. Mach, Tony Krafka, Kevin Slama, Max Birkel, Scott Steager, Greg Janak, and David Potter.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof, by Publication, a designated method for giving notice, as shown by the Proof of Publication attached to the minutes. Notice of this meeting was given to all members of the Board and a copy of their acknowledgement of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to all members of the board of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all present.

The Chairman called the meeting to order, and announced that a complete copy of the Open Meetings Act is posted in the meeting room.

The Chairman declared the minutes of the previous meeting shall stand approved as presented.

NBCS Report Forms/Approval & Certification

The Road Department's annual report to the Board of Public Roads and Classification and Standards was presented for the board's approval and certification. This matter is tabled till the County Attorney obtains information as to the due date of the report and the individual authorized to sign the documents.

Benefits for Interim Department Head for County Road Department

The Interim Department Head for the County Road Department was hired as a temporary employee. Temporary employees are not eligible for County benefits. It was the consensus of the board not to change the employee's status at this time.

Permit to Construct Utilities on County Right-of-Way

A permit to construct utilities on county right-of-way was submitted by Gary Vandenberg for Dorothy Hladky to install a tile outlet between Section 23 and Section 26; Township 15 North, Range 3 East. Moved by Janak, seconded by Slama to approve the permit request as presented. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Janak, Birkel, Potter, Slama, Krafka, Steager, and Mach. The following voted nay: None. Motion carried.

Discussion on Emergency Call-Out Policy for Road Department

Chairman Mach stated that he placed the discussion of an emergency call-out policy on the agenda. He, along with other board members had been contacted by Road Department employees about the need for an emergency call-out policy which would compensate employees who are called-out for emergency situations after working hours.

Chairman Mach said that he had contacted Pam Bourne, who answers the NIRMA (Nebraska Intergovernmental Risk Management Association) employment law help line, asking for legal advice and asked that she draft an emergency callout policy.

Chairman Mach stated that he felt the County Attorney is micro-managing the County Board, and questioned the need to seek outside counsel for the board. He also spoke of accusations of misconduct being made against the board.

The County Attorney responded by saying that she is not micro-managing the board, but trying to keep the board within the law. She went on to say that the board could seek outside counsel, but that decision would need to be based on a decision of the whole board, not one member or subcommittee.

It was stated by Tom Kobus, Interim Department Head for the County Road Department, that the moral of the road department employees is very low, and he has a concern as to the employees' willingness to respond in emergency situations, an emergency call-out policy is needed.

On September 24, 2018 the Employee Handbook Committee met with elected officials and department heads to discuss issues with the Employee Handbook. One of the items discussed was an emergency call-out policy. The committee members shared with the board their recommendation for an emergency call-out policy. The Chairman and board members asked the County Attorney to draft an Addendum to the Employee Handbook (Emergency Call-Out Policy), following the recommendations of the Employee Handbook Committee, to be placed on the agenda for the next meeting.

Supervisor Steager asked who would need to approve amendments or addendums to the Employee Handbook. The County Attorney consulted with Pam Bourne, who said any amendment or addendum to the employee handbook needs to be approved by all elected officials.

Karey Adamy questioned why the adopted employee handbook is being changed or challenged by one department.

Louise Niemann stated that the handbook needs to be interpreted the same for all departments.

Supervisor Birkel challenged all board members to contact other counties for their employee handbooks and policies that have been adopted concerning overtime calculation and other issues.

Discussion of Open Meeting Laws and Board Committees

The County Attorney handed out the Open Meetings Act to all supervisors, and stated that public meeting laws are being violated in committee meetings.

It was discussed that at a recent Road and Bridge Committee meeting, the committee conducted an employment interview. The County Attorney stated that what is going on in committee meetings is over and above what is allowed. The Road and Bridge committee historically was a committee to talk about roads and bridges, not personnel issues. At this time, hiring employees for the Road Department needs to come before the entire board.

Supervisor Birkel suggested that any hiring of any new employees wait until the Highway Superintendent position is filled.

The County Attorney stated that the date and time of committee meetings needs to be scheduled during an open meeting of the board. For each committee of the board, there should be established the reason that the committee was formed, purpose of the committee, procedures to follow during committee meetings, scheduling of meetings, who will be present, and subject matters that will be discussed. Minutes should be taken during the committee meeting, and no formal action can be taken. Any policy discussion needs to be in open meeting before the entire board, not in committee.

Supervisor Potter added that a committee should act as a recommendation committee to the whole board.

Moved by Slama, seconded by Steager to enter Board of Equalization. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Slama, Krafka, Steager, Janak, Birkel, Potter, and Mach. The following voted nay: None. Motion carried.

At 10:35 a.m., Chairman Mach announced that the Board would reconvene.

Butler County Landfill Discussion

Kelly Danielson, Butler County Landfill appeared before the board to discuss a Host Fee Agreement. He stated that he had met with the Landfill Committee several times to discuss the offering of a host fee. Upon approval of the Host Fee Agreement, the county could receive from the landfill approximately \$375,000.00 - \$400,000.00, based on 60¢ per ton (excluding cover), with a minimum of \$375,000.00. Mr. Danielson stated that there would be no strings attached to the host fee. The attorneys for the landfill will be contacting the County Attorney to discuss the drafting of an agreement for the board to consider.

Certification of Cost Allocation Plan

Maximus has submitted the FY 2017 Cost Allocation Plan for the county's review. Moved by Potter, seconded by Krafka to authorize the Chairman to sign the Certification of Cost Allocation Plan. Addendum to Employee Handbook

A letter of support for the addendums was read from Karey Adamy, County Treasurer who was not able to attend the meeting.

Supervisor Birkel said that he had checked with 14 other counties and none of those counties even had a call-out policy.

Tom Kobus stated that even with the policy, employees may still not be responsive to emergency call-outs.

The County Attorney stated that premium pay can be determined at any rate. There should be job descriptions for each employee, and negative repercussions for employees who refuse to answer emergency call-outs.

Supervisor Krafka asked who would approve these addendums to the Employee Handbook. The County Attorney responded that the addendums would need to be approved by all elected officials.

The representatives from the Road Department that were in attendance at the meeting stated they felt the employees would not be satisfied with the call-out policy as it is written.

Supervisors Steager, Slama, and Krafka will schedule a meeting with the Road Department employees to hear the employees concerns with the Employee Handbook, and report back to the board on November 5, 2018.
